CHARGES ARE REMOVED

Α.

HE HAS FORGIVEN ALL SIN

"Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: ² By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." (Romans 5:1-2)

HE CONTINUES TO FORGIVE

"But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin." (1 John 1:7)

Quote: "So for the believer, we are positioned as righteous in Christ Jesus (justification), but we still sin daily and need to purify ourselves through confession and repentance of sin—the way of fellowship and growth. This is sanctification."
