BRANCHES NOT BEARING FRUIT

BRANCHES BEARING FRUIT

Definition: *purgeth*—to cleanse, of filth impurity, to prune trees and vines from useless shoots.

Quote: "The branches of the autumn will well repay each stroke of that keen edge with fuller, richer fruit. So we gain by loss; we live as we die; the inward man is renewed as the outward decays." **—F.B. Meyer**

A. Abiding Brings_

Definition: *abide*—to remain, to tarry and not depart, to continue or wait

Quote: "What does it mean to "abide"? It means to keep in fellowship with Christ so that His life can work in and through us to produce fruit."—**Warren Wiersbe**

HOW WE ABIDE IN CHRIST

1. We Must Be Secure in His Salvation

"In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise, 14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory." (Ephesians 1:13–14)

2. We Must Remain in His Love

"As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love." (John 15:9)

Quote: "This abiding relationship is natural to the branch and the vine, but it must be cultivated in the Christian life. It is not automatic. Abiding in Christ demands worship, meditation on God's Word, prayer, sacrifice, and service—but what a joyful experience it is! Once you have begun to cultivate this deeper communion with Christ, you have no desire to return to the shallow life of the careless Christian."—**Warren Wiersbe**

3. We Must Remain under His Leading

"But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his." (Romans 8:9)

(1 Corinthians 3:7-9) "And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." (Psalm 1:3)
