Definition: adoption—son placing

"Having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will, 6 To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved." (Ephesians 1:5-6)

"In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise, 14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory." (Ephesians 1:13-14)

B. The ______ of the Adopted

ACCESS TO THE FATHER

Definition: Abba—the word father in the most personal and intimate sense, a term of endearment

"And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father." (Galatians 4:6)

"Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)

ASSURANCE FROM THE SPIRIT

Definition: beareth witness—to give evidence

"Who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." (1 Peter 1:5)

Definition: *heir*—one who receives his allotted possession by right of sonship; one who has acquired or obtained the portion allotted to him

"Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ." (Galatians 4:7)

THE AWARDS OF A JOINT-HEIR

Definition: *joint-heirs*—a fellow heir; one who obtains something assigned to himself with others

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ:" (Ephesians 1:3)

"Having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will, 6 To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved." (Ephesians 1:5-6)

THE ASSIGNMENTS WITH THE JOINT-HEIR

"Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession. 15 For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin." (Hebrews 4:14–15)
