## 1. Exchange Self-Will for a Surrendered Will to God

### STOP LYING

**Definition:** *lying*—any deceit in word, act, attitude, or silence; in deliberate exaggerations, in distortions of the truth, or in creating false impressions

"Lying lips are abomination to the Lord: but they that deal truly are his delight." (Proverbs 12:22)

### SPEAK THE TRUTH

"But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ:" (Ephesians 4:15)

**Quote:** "It is better to be divided by truth than to be united in error. It is better to speak the truth that hurts and then heals, than falsehood that comforts and then kills. It is not love and it is not friendship if we fail to declare the whole counsel of God."—**Adrian Rogers**

# B. Against \_\_\_\_\_

**Definition:** *righteous indignation*—anger at evil and sin

**Definition:** *sinful anger*—self-defensive and self-serving

"Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:" (Ephesians 4:31)

# **WAYS RELATIONSHIPS ARE DIVIDED**

- 1. Bitterness—to cut or prick
- 2. Wrath—hot passion
- 3. Anger—violent emotion
- 4. Clamour—a crying, outcry, a loud noisy complaining
- 5. Evil Speaking slander, detraction

**6. Malice**—the desire to malign someone's name, spite **Quote:** "Anger is never without a reason, but seldom with a good one."—**Ben Franklin**
