Philippians 2:9-11 Bow the Knee Sunday Evening August 16, 2020 John Goetsch

Philippians 2:9-11 Wherefore [Because of who Jesus is and how much He humbled Himself] God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: ¹⁰That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; ¹¹And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

- 1. Introduction:
 - a. Highly exalted
 - i. Jesus will receive great respect
 - ii. How will we approach Jesus at God's throne for the first time? Every knee shall bow everyone (saved and unsaved) will bow down, though not at the same occasion
 - iii. The great confession: that Jesus Christ is Lord. 'Lord' is a title of honor expressing respect and reverence. Slaves call their owners 'Lord' and servants greet their masters as 'Lord'.
 - b. Three motivating factors to bowing our knee
- 2. First Motivator: <u>Superior Stature</u> (Jesus is above anyone, anywhere)
 - a. Jesus' personhood (humanity)

Philippians 2:5-6 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: ⁶Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God [didn't show off His deity while He performed the mission His Father sent Him to do]

i. Jesus Christ is God

John 1:1, 3 In the beginning was the Word [Jesus], and the Word [Jesus] was with God, and **the Word** [Jesus] **was God**. ... ³All things were made by him [Jesus]; and without him was not anything made that was made [and there is nothing in all creation was not made by Him].

John 10:30 / [Jesus] and my Father are one.

ii. Whoever sees God the Son also sees God the Father

John 14:9 Jesus saith unto him [Philip], Have I been so long time with you, and yet hast thou not known me, Philip? **he that hath seen me hath seen the Father**; and how sayest thou then, Shew us the Father?

iii. Peter declares Jesus deity

Matthew 16:16 And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, **the Son of the living God**.

iv. Paul declares that the resurrection of Jesus powerfully proclaims Him to be the Son of God

Romans 1:3-4 Concerning his [God's] Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh; ⁴And **declared to be the Son of God with power**, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:

v. Contrary to philosophy & traditions, deity lives inside Jesus' body

Colossians 2:9 For in him [Jesus] dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.

- b. Jesus purity
 - i. Only Jesus is without sin

1 John 3:5 And ye know that he [Jesus] was manifested to take away our sins; and **in him is no sin**.

ii. Jesus was tempted in the same way as any person, but without yielding to sin

Hebrews 4:15 For we have not an high priest [Jesus] which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities [who is not isolated from our human weaknesses]; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.

iii. Peter calls Jesus as a lamb without blemish or spot

1 Peter 1:19 *But* [you are redeemed] *with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot*:

iv. Jesus did no sin

1 Peter 2:22 *Who* [Jesus] *did no sin*, neither was guile [deceit] found in his mouth:

- c. Jesus power
 - i. Power to rebuke demonic world

Luke 4:34-35 [A demon-possessed man in a synagogue was] Saying, "Let us alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art; the Holy One of God." ³⁵And Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Hold thy peace [Don't say anything more], and come out of him." And when the devil had thrown him in the midst, he came out of him, and hurt him not.

ii. Power to redeem to bring a man with Himself on the day they died

Luke 23:42-43 And he [the thief on the cross] said unto Jesus, "Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom." ⁴³And Jesus said unto him, "Verily [Truthfully] I say unto thee, Today shalt thou be with me in paradise."

iii. Power to restore the demon-possessed man from Gadara to his right mind

Mark 5:15 And they [the people of the village] come to Jesus, and see him that was possessed with the devil, and had the legion, sitting, and clothed, and in his right mind: and they were afraid.

iv. Power of raise the dead back to life

John 11:25, 43-44 Jesus said unto her [Martha, whose brother had just died], "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: ..." ⁴³And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth." ⁴⁴And **he that was dead came forth**, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, "Loose him, and let him go."

v. All Christians look forward to our future resurrection

1 Corinthians 15:51-52 Behold, *I* [Paul] shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep [die], but we shall all be changed [given an immortal body], ⁵²In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we [who are still alive] shall be changed.

- 3. **Second Motivator**: <u>Supreme Sacrifice</u> (Jesus offered Himself as the perfect payment for everyone's sin)
 - a. Christians recognized Jesus as their Savior
 - b. In Jesus' humanity
 - i. Jesus (God the Son) became human

John 1:14 And **the Word** [Jesus] **was made flesh**, and dwelt [lived] among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

ii. Jesus (God the Son) became a servant

Philippians 2:7 But made himself [Jesus] of no reputation, and **took upon him the form of a servant**, and was made in the likeness of men.

iii. The Son of Man [Jesus] is "God with us"

Matthew 1:23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name **Emmanuel**, which being interpreted [translated] is, God with us.

iv. God judged our sin in the flesh of Jesus' body on the cross

Rom 8:3 For what the law could not do [make us righteous enough for God], in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh: [What the law could not do...God did for us because of His love] v. God the Son was 1) made of a woman, and 2) made at the right time

Galatians 4:4-5 But when **the fulness of the time was come**, God sent forth his Son, **made of a woman**, made under the law, ⁵To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.

- c. In Jesus' humiliation
 - i. Jesus was humiliated by His death on the cross

Philippians 2:8 And being found in fashion [appearance] as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

ii. Philip explained Jesus' humiliating death to Ethiopian eunuch

Acts 8:32-33, 35 The place of the scripture which he [the Ethiopian eunuch] read was this, "He was led as a sheep to the slaughter; and like a lamb dumb [silent] before his shearer, so opened he not his mouth: ³³In his humiliation his judgment [justice] was taken away [was denied to Him]: and who shall declare his generation? [who is going to remember Him?] for his life is taken from the earth." ... ³⁵Then Philip opened his mouth, and began at the same scripture, and preached unto him Jesus.

iii. Jesus described Himself as the Good Shepherd defending His sheep with His life

John 10:11 *I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.*

iv. God's grace to all people

2 Corinthians 8:9 For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, **though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor**, that ye through his poverty might be rich.

v. Jesus suffered a shameful death

Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

4. **Third Motivator**: <u>Settled Sovereignty</u> (Jesus has shown Himself to be God in many ways)

- a. God has highly exalted Jesus' efficacy
 - i. Efficacy: fancy word for producing God's intended result
 - ii. God has given Jesus a name above everything else

Philippians 2:9 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:

iii. Christians complete in Jesus – we need no other

Colossians 2:10 And **ye are complete in him** [Jesus], which is the head of all principality [ruler] and power [authority]:

iv. God the Father was pleased to have all the fulness of God living in Jesus

Colossians 1:19 For it pleased the Father that in him should all fulness [of God] dwell;

v. God has enough riches to supply all Christian needs

Philippians 4:19 But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

- b. God has highly exalted Jesus' eternality
 - i. Jesus Christ is eternal
 - ii. Every Believer's home in heaven is eternal
 - iii. God's kingdom is an everlasting kingdom

Psalm 145:13 *Thy kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and thy dominion endureth throughout all generations.*

iv. Christians sheltered in God's unchanging eternal "arms"

Deuteronomy 33:27 The eternal God is thy refuge [place of safety], and **underneath are the everlasting arms**: and he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee; and shall say, Destroy them.

v. Jesus from infinity past to today to infinity future

Revelation 1:4 John [the Apostle] to the seven churches which are in Asia: Grace be unto you, and peace, from **him** [Jesus] **which is, and which was, and which is to come**; and from the seven Spirits which are before his throne;

vi. God describes Himself as the One who lives forever & there is none other like Him

Deuteronomy 32:39-40 See now that I, even I, am he [God], and there is no [other] god with me: I kill, and I make alive; I wound, and I heal: neither is there any that can deliver out of my hand. ⁴⁰For I lift up my hand to heaven, and say, "I live forever."

5. Conclusion

- a. We should always be ready to bow in humble thanksgiving
- b. We should be eager to kneel before Jesus the Lord and exalt Him
- c. We should always call on the name of the Lord
