Luke 2:1-10 Three Lessons From Bethlehem

Luke 2:1-7 And it came to pass in those days [the days after John the Baptist was born], that there went out a decree [a command] from Caesar Augustus [the Emperor of the Roman world], that all the world should be taxed.<sup>2</sup>(And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.) <sup>3</sup>And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city [the city that the family's ancestors came from]. <sup>4</sup>And Joseph also went up<sup>1</sup> from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:)<sup>5</sup>To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. <sup>6</sup>And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered [that she went into the pre-birth pains of labor]. <sup>7</sup>And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes [a linen baby blanket], and laid him in a manger [similar to a cattle trough]; because there was no room for them in the inn. <sup>8</sup>And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. <sup>9</sup>And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. <sup>10</sup>And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.

  - 3. They were poor people
  - 4. They obeyed the Roman government and registered for a taxation census
  - 5. They made a bed for the newborn Jesus in the manger in a stable

    - 1. Shepherds in fields around Bethlehem
    - 2. Shepherds at the bottom of economic ladder
    - 3. This showed that Jesus made available to all people
