John 1:40-42 One of the two [Andrew and an unidentified disciple of John the Baptist] which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. ⁴¹He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, "We have found the Messiah," which is, being interpreted, the Christ. ⁴²And he [Andrew] brought him [Simon Peter] to Jesus. And when Jesus beheld him, he said, "Thou art Simon the son of Jonah: thou shalt be called Cephas," which is by interpretation, A stone.

I. Introduction

- A. We are living in the last days (2 Peter 3:3); the days of perilous times
 - 2 Timothy 3:1–5 *This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come.* ² *For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous* [greedy], *boasters* [arrogant], *proud, blasphemers* [ungodly], *disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy* [without reverence for anything], ³ *Without natural affection* [no sympathy, heartless], *trucebreakers* [refusing to reconcile], *false accusers* [slanderers], *incontinent* [without self-control], *fierce* [cruel, brutal], *despisers of those that are good* [disliking people simply because they do good], ⁴ *Traitors, heady* [reckless], *high-minded* [conceited, full of pride], *lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God;* ⁵ *Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof* [trying to appear like they are godly but not knowing the power that comes from Him]: *from such turn away*.
 - 1. People of the last days
 - a. Boasters, high-minded, or proud people
 - b. Lovers of pleasure
 - c. People despise those who are good
 - d. People who have unnatural affection (alternate lifestyles)
 - e. People who have a form of godliness
 - 2. But God wants Christian to be very different
 - a. As Christian grows in Christ, speak truth of doctrine in love Ephesians 4:15 But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things [our lives should mature and become more like Christ in every way], which is the head, even Christ:
 - b. As Christian, seek & pray for the peace of your city

 Jeremiah 29:7 And seek the peace of the city whither I have caused you
 to be carried away captives [Any you Jews, when you are captured by your enemy
 and taken as slaves to Babylon, live in peace with that city], and pray unto the
 LORD for it: for in the peace thereof shall ye have peace.

- B. John the Baptist was voice for the Lord
 - 1. Prophetic voice as told in the Scriptures
 - a. Voice of one crying in the wilderness Isaiah 40:3
 - b. Voice of preparing the way of the Lord Malachi 3:1
 - 2. Recorded in all 4 gospels Matthew 3:1-3, Mark 1:1-4, Luke 3:2-4, John 1:22-23
- C. People's response to John the Baptist's preaching
 - 1. Jewish religious authorities (priests, Levites, & Pharisees)
 - a. They asked him "Who are you? John 1:19
 - b. They asked if he was Elijah the Prophet, who had been promised to come back before the Messiah Malachi 3:5-6
 - c. They asked if he was "the prophet" promised by Moses Deuteronomy 18:15, 18
 - d. They asked if he was the coming promised Messiah
 - e. He answered all their questions by saying, "I indeed baptize you with water; but one mightier than I cometh, the latchet of whose shoes I am not worthy to unloose..." (Luke 3:16)
 - 2. Many were John the Baptist's disciples
 - John the Baptist preached God's message of repentance to all those he baptized
 - b. His disciples were all over the Roman empire Acts 18:24-25, 19:3
 - 3. Two of John the Baptist's disciples are noted in this passage
 - a. Context (background) given in John 1:35-42
 - b. John the Baptist declares Jesus of Nazareth as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world John 1:29, 36
 - c. Those 2 disciples stopped following John and began following Jesus
 - They follow after Jesus of Nazareth verse 37
 - ii. Jesus asks them who they're looking for verse 38
 - iii. They ask him where he is staying verse 38
 - iv. He directs them to come & see verse 39
 - d. Presumed that one was John the Apostle, writer of John's gospel
 - e. The other was clearly identified as Andrew, the quiet brother of Simon (Peter)
 - f. Andrew's life changed because John the Baptist declared the Messiah

II. Voice of Compassion

A. Compassion of Christ

- 1. Jesus showed Andrew compassion by answering his questions
- 2. Andrew shared Messiah's compassion with his brother Simon
- 3. Jesus loved his disciples with all his heart
- 4. Most of Jesus' disciples were common working men with only a basic education
- 5. But being with Jesus gave them wise speech & use in Scripture

Acts 4:13 Now when they [the Jewish ruling counsel] saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were unlearned and ignorant men [and they could see from their speaking that they were ordinary men with no special Bible training], they marveled; and they took knowledge of them, [and they remembered] that they had been with Jesus.

- 6. Jesus Christ brings spiritual awareness
 - a. Fresh anointing from God
 - b. Tender heart for other people

B. Mission of Christ

- 1. Andrew had a mission
 - a. Andrew mission was finding the Messiah & sharing him

 John 1:41 He [Andrew] first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, "We have found the Messiah," which is, being interpreted, the Christ.
 - b. Seed planted by Andrew grew in his brother Simon's heart

 Psalm 126:6 He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed,
 shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him
 [The person who is sad when going out to plant seeds will return as a happy person with
 many crops when the harvest comes].
- 2. <u>Christian</u> has a mission ministry & word of reconciation
 - a. Apostle Paul became a new creation in Christ when he became a Christian
 - 2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore **if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature** [person]: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
 - b. God reconciled Christians to Himself by Jesus Christ
 - 2 Corinthians 5:18 And all things are of [And this new person is from] **God**, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and **hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation**;

- c. How does God reconcile us, even though we're sinners? God does not see us because we are in Christ, but rather sees His beloved Son.
 - 2 Corinthians 5:19 *To wit* [The ministry of reconciliation means this:], that **God** was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing [charging] their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation.
- d. Christians are ambassadors for Christ

2 Corinthians 5:20 Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech [plead with] you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead [we're asking you, and we are asking because Christ has sent us to do so], be ye reconciled to God.

III. Voice of Communication

A. Share the <u>discovery</u>

Romans 10:11 For the scripture saith, "Whosoever believeth on him [Christ] shall not be ashamed."

1. Not ashamed of the gospel of Christ

Romans 1:16 For I [Paul] am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

2. Give your reasonable service to God

Romans 12:1 I beseech [plead with] you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

- 3. Joyful to sharing out of the heart
- B. Share the truth
 - 1. Andrew tells Simon of his discovery

John 1:41 He [Andrew] first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, "We have found the Messiah," which is, being interpreted, the Christ.

2. Gospel based on Jesus Christ

1 Corinthians 15:3-4 For I [Paul] delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; ⁴ And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:

IV. Voice of Cooperation

A. Christian cooperates

- Andrew brought Simon & is an example of a Christian working together with Christ
 - 1 Corinthians 3:9 For we are laborers together with God: ye are God's husbandry [you are the field where God's seeds are planted], ye are God's building.
- 2. God calls Christian to be His witness to everyone
 - Acts 1:8 But **ye** [disciples] **shall receive power**, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.
- 3. Witnessing is ministry of everyone in the church (not just paid staff)

 Proverbs 11:30 The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life; and he that winneth souls is wise.

B. God converts

- 1. Holy Spirit convicts the souls of men
 - John 16:8 And when he [the Holy Spirit] is come, he will reprove [convict] the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:
- 2. Holy Spirit testifies of Jesus Christ
 - John 15:26 But when the Comforter [the Holy Spirit] is come, whom I [Jesus] will send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceedeth from the Father, he shall testify of me:
- 3. God converts the soul on the foundation of Jesus Christ
 - 1 Corinthians 3:11 For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid [For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already there], which is Jesus Christ.
- 4. Jesus the chief cornerstone
 - a. Simon renamed to Peter, which means "small stone."
 - b. Jesus called the chief cornerstone
 - Ephesians 2:20 And are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, **Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone**;
 - c. Peter calls Jesus Christ the chief cornerstone
 - 1 Peter 2:6 Wherefore also it [the spiritual house made of living stones (Christians)] is contained in the scripture, "Behold, I lay in Zion a chief corner stone, elect, precious: and he that believeth on him [Jesus] shall not be confounded [put to shame]."
