Psalm 31:14-15 ¹⁴ But I trusted in thee, O Lord: I said, "Thou art my God. ¹⁵ **My times are in thy hand** [You control the length of my life and everything that happens to me]: deliver me from the hand of mine enemies, and [deliver me] from [the hand of] them that persecute me."

- I. Introduction: God's people will experience trouble just like everyone else
 - A. David gave the reason in verse 9 whey he wrote verses 14-15

Psalm 31:9 Have mercy upon me, O LORD, for I am in trouble: mine eye is consumed with grief, yea, my soul and my belly [The pressure on me is causing my vision to be blurred, my stomach to be upset and my soul to want to quit].

- 1. David feels like he is in trouble
- 2. He feels like his body aches & he's consumed with grief
- B. David had many life experiences with troubles
 - 1. As shepherd, he killed a lion, bear, & even the giant Goliath
 - 2. As King Saul's son-in-law
 - a. King Saul became jealous of David
 - b. King Saul tried to kill David several times
 - c. David ran for his life & hid from Saul
 - 3. When he was king, David's son Absalom rebelled against him
 - a. Absalom proclaimed himself king
 - b. David ran out of Jerusalem in fear for his life
 - c. Absalom pursued his father to kill him
 - d. King David had troubles with other sons & daughters due to his own sins
- C. Current times in society today
 - 1. Everyone is stressed because of the COVID virus and quarantines
 - 2. Political, economic, & social woes in these troublesome times
 - 3. Christians offer hope to the world around them
- II. My Times
 - A. Changing seasons of life all have their own pressures
 - 1. Childhood has its own stresses, mostly social
 - 2. Young adulthood adds the stress of pending adulthood to the pressures of childhood

- 3. The season of life as working adults raising a family add the stresses of providing for children to all the previous pressures of life
- Senior/retirement years bring many health issues and the confrontation of our own mortality
- B. Personal times: My times are in God's hands
 - 1. Life happens
 - a. Sometimes I feel in control of my life
 - Other times I have unanticipated events in my life that cause grief or distress
 - 2. Bible full of stories of people & events in their lives
 - 3. Thankfully God is stable & does not change

Malachi 3:6 For I am the LORD, I change not; therefore ye sons of Jacob [meaning God's people who are disobedient] are not consumed.

- III. God's Hands reveal to us how God takes special care of His people
 - A. God's character
 - 1. God's attributes
 - a. Omnipotence: God is all powerful (see Jeremiah 32:17)
 - b. Omnipresence: God is present everywhere (see Jeremiah 23:23, 24)
 - c. Omniscience: God is all knowing (see Psalm 147:5)
 - 2. God's characteristics
 - a. Immanence: God in the world

Acts 17:27 That they [the people of the earth] should seek the Lord, if haply they might feel after him [if they might reach out to Him], and find him, though he be not far from every one of us:

Matthew 1:23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, **God with us**.

b. Immutability: God never changes (see Malachi 3:6 above)

James 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning [for He never changes no matter what perspective He is viewed from].

 Impassibility: God does not experience sudden emotional changes like humans, does not make bad emotional decisions

Numbers 23:19 God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent [that He changes His mind]: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good? [If God says something, He will do it; if God promises something, He will make sure it happens.]

- d. Impeccability (Holiness): God cannot & does not sin
 - 1 Samuel 2:2 There is none holy as the LORD: for there is none beside thee: neither is there any rock like our God.
 - 1 Peter 2:22-23 ²² Who [Jesus] did no sin, neither was guile [deceit] found in his mouth: ²³Who, when he was reviled [criticized angrily], reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously:
- e. Incomprehensibility: God cannot be fully understood by man

 Isaiah 55:9 For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.
- f. Incorporeality: God has no physical form

Isaiah 40:18 To whom then will ye liken God [What example can you give so that someone can understand God]? or what likeness [physical form] will ye compare unto him?

John 4:24 God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.

B. God's is sovereign

- 1. Sovereign means "ruling over all things"
- 2. Related to God being all powerful
- God rules over all times & seasons

Daniel 2:20-21 ²⁰ Daniel answered [responded to the vision God had just given to him] and said, "Blessed be the name of God for ever and ever: for wisdom and might are his: ²¹ And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings: he giveth wisdom unto the wise, and knowledge to them that know understanding:"

4. God rules over all nations

Job 12:23 He increaseth the nations, and destroyeth them: he enlargeth the nations, and straiteneth [reduces] them again.

5. God rules the times of my personal life

Ecclesiastes 3:1, 10 ¹ To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: ... ¹⁰ I have seen the travail, which God hath given to the sons of men to be exercised in it [I have seen the hard work which God has given to people to keep them busy in this life].

C. God is <u>personal</u> and knows your circumstances

- 1. Personal confession
 - a. David called God his personal God in so many ways

Psalm 18:2 The LORD is <u>my</u> rock, and <u>my</u> fortress, and <u>my</u> deliverer; <u>my</u> God, <u>my</u> strength, in whom I will trust; <u>my</u> buckler [God is what I hide behind for protection], and the horn of <u>my</u> salvation [God is what I cling to when I am in trouble], and <u>my</u> high tower [God is the place I go when I am in danger].

b. God is the Creator of each person

Isaiah 45:18 For thus saith the LORD that created the heavens; God himself that formed the earth and made it; he hath established it, he created it not in vain [God did not create the earth without a purpose], he formed it to be inhabited: I am the LORD; and there is none else.

c. But He is also the Savior of each person

Isaiah 43:11 I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no savior.

Acts 4:12 Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name [Jesus] under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved [for there is only one name that men can call out to on earth so they can be saved].

d. But God invites each person to come into His family

John 1:12 But as many as received him [Jesus], to them gave he power to become the sons of God [But all the people who received Him were given power to become the sons of God], even to them that believe on his name:

e. Anyone can call upon God's name

Romans 10:13 For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

f. Human responsibility to personally trust God

Romans 10:9-10 ⁹ That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

- 2. Personal call (an example of how God knows your circumstances)
 - a. Jesus walking on the water Matthew 14:22-32, Mark 6:45-52, John 6:15-21
 - i. Jesus finished feeding over 5000 people
 - ii. Disciples were told by Jesus to leave & sail across Sea of Galilee towards Capernaum; Jesus wanted to stay behind and pray
 - iii. While the disciples were sailing a great contrary wind blowing against the boat at night

- iv. They saw Jesus walking on the water, as if He were going to pass by their boat
- v. They were extremely worried & afraid for their lives
- vi. They call out to Jesus; He comes to them and gets into their boat.
- vii. Immediately the storm ceased; the disciples are amazed
- viii. Sometimes God sends Christian into unseen circumstances so we can learn to trust His ways, regardless of the situation
- b. We can prepare our hearts before times of trouble
 - David knew God before any crisis came into his life. David made the decision to trust God in his youth
 - ii. Joseph lived as slave from age 17 to age 30, but knew God was in control of his circumstances.
 - iii. God is never overwhelmed or unsure of what to do next.
 - iv. In all times we are to give thanks
 - 1 Thessalonians 5:18 *In everything give thanks*: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.
 - v. Christians need to continuously stay connected to God

 John 15:5 / [Jesus] am the vine, ye [disciples, Christians] are the branches:

 He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same [that person] bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.
 - vi. God wants Christian to live fruitful life

 John 15:8 Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

IV. Conclusion

- A. Christian response?
 - 1. Trust God? or Attitude with God because you don't like your circumstances?
 - 2. Natural response to blame God for bad events
 - 3. Guard against natural pushing away from God (the "I can handle this situation by myself" attitude) when trouble is near.
- B. Trust in the living God
 - 1. Trust in God in your day of trouble

Nahum 1:7 The LORD is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; and he knoweth them that trust in him.

- 2. Trust in God who raises the dead back to life
 - 2 Corinthians 1:9 But we [Paul and his companions] had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead:
- 3. Trust in God who is Savior for all men
 - 1 Timothy 4:10 For therefore we [all Christians] both labor [in the work God has selected us to do] and suffer reproach [because we are working for God and not our own interests], because we trust in the living God, who is the Savior of all men, specially of those that believe.
