1. Introduction

- a. Context: Eph 5: 21-33
- b. Written by apostle Paul
- c. God established family with Adam & Eve in Gen 2:18-25
 - Mt 19:4-6 Jesus view of marriage
- d. Verse 25 focuses on husband

1. Sacrificial love selfless (vs. 25)

- a. Not selfish
 - action of husband to love wife
 - husband willing to give himself for her
- b. Love measured in actions
 - verbally
 - facial expressions / body language
 - actions
- c. Moral practices set by Scriptures
 - husband's behavior
 - wife's behavior
 - children's behavior
 - structure & order in the family
 - structure & order in the family

2. Sacrificial love sanctifies (vs. 26-27)

- a. What does word "sanctify" mean?
 - "to set apart" as in daily living
 - to learn to live holy
- b. How God cleans soul of Christian
 - "Washing of the water by the Word" (vs 26)
 - uses metaphor to take out spots on dirty clothes with washing
 - Word of God cleans the soul
- c. Scripture instructs person to leave sinful practices of living
 - God wants a holy church
 - church in news headlines of immoral & illegal practices is not God's church but man's church

- a. Family devotions
- b. Church attendance
- c. Internet safety
- d. Family boundaries

4. Sacrificial Love Keeps Safe (secure) - (vs 28-29)

a. Security

- safety
- example: fencing, security doors, security gates

b. Concept of cherish

- nourishing the body
 - * keep body warm or cool with clothing
 - * feeding body with good food
 - * keeping body safe in shelter
- cherish body
 - * taking care of yourself
 - * enough sleep & rest
 - * going to doctor when sick

c. Examples on brotherly love

- 1 John 3:15-17 not sharing needed supplies ~~when brother has needs~~
- James 2:15-17 dead ~~faith~~ not sharing needed food & clothing with destitute brother or sister
