2. Perfect Love-Assuring Love

- a. In day of judgment
 - assured place of love in final days of reward & judgment
 - have boldness standing in Christ
- b. Two seats of judgment
 - = Judgment Seat of Christ
 - * Bema Seat for Christians
 - * for rewards, winners of the race
 - * 2 Cor 5:9-10 for earthly life
 - * 1 Cor 3:12-15 all work tested
 - = Great White Throne
 - * Rev 20:11-15 books were opened
 - * All humans judged according to their works
 - * Mt 12:36-37 every word judged
- c. Knowing your future-position in Christ
 - example: receiving your grade for a school class
 - keeping eternity in mind
 - Jesus Knows Christian - Jn 10:27
 - Christian hears Jesus voice
 - Jesus already carried sin judgment at the cross
~~but now not payed~~
 - Eph 1:6 accepted in the Beloved
 - * identification in Christ
