1. Introduction

- a. Context: 2 Cor. 12:6-10
- b. Corinth ancient city on Greek isthmus
  - Wealthy from crossroads of trade
- c. Corinth also known as center of pleasure seekers - lots disposable income
- d. Apostle Paul appears to have natural inclination towards pride
  - Paul highly educated in Greek thinking
  - Paul highly educated in Jewish religious studies
- e. But God chose timing of Paul's conversion - Acts 9:5-8; 13:9; 14:1-16
  - God showed Paul's future service through weakness & suffering

2. Paul's Painful Thorn (vs. 7)

- a. God showed Paul great prophetic revelations
  - God requires truth in His people
  - Paul wanted people to see him realistically (vs. 6)
- b. Paul did not want this "thorn in the flesh" - he didn't like it
- c. But God had a purpose
  - God knew Paul ~~was~~
  - ~~God did not want him exalted above measure~~ - put on a pedestal
  - God did not want him put on a pedestal ("exalted beyond measure")  

    - God's grace sufficient
    - Paul's strength
- d. God's thorn
  - first of the flesh - physical
  - 2nd messenger of Satan - spiritual
  - God's thorn specifically designed for each Christian

### 3. Paul's Persistent Prayer (vs. 8)

- a. Paul asks God for relief
  - from Paul's viewpoint, this was unbearable
- b. Paul begged God to remove his thorn
  - he did not want it
- c. Paul prayed 3 times before he got an answer

### 4. Paul's Painful Lessons (vs. 9)

- a. God answers Paul
  - God gives positive reason for Paul's thorn
  - And God did not remove His thorn
- b. God's grace is sufficient
  - sufficient = enough
- c. God's strength made perfect in weakness (human weakness)
  - human Christian reaches end of their strength & ability
  - God adds His power & strength for Christian's spiritual journey
  - perfect = complete
- d. Acronym GRACE
  - G - God's R - Resource A - at
  - C - Christ's E - Expense
  - \* Jesus Christ paid everything to give God's grace to Christian
    - Jesus died on the cross & buried
    - Jesus came alive from dead 3rd day
- e. Paul wanted God's power to stay on him

### 5. Paul's New Perspective (vs. 10)

- a. Paul accepted God's thorn
- b. Paul gloried (took pleasure) in God's thorn for Christ's sake
  - Paul wanted to stay in God's design
- c. Paul experienced so many difficulties
  - weakness, needs, persecutions, distresses
- d. Paul strong in God's grace when he is weakness
