"Jesus Heals Bent Woman"

1. Introduction

- a. Jesus was teaching in synagogue on Sabbath Day
- b. Woman had skeleton deformity
 - she was bent over & could not stand straight up
 - she had deformity 18 years
- c. Jesus called her to come to front of synagogue
- d. Jesus spoke to her about what he would do
- e. Jesus simply laid His hands on her
 - her body immediately became straight - straight bones
- f. Woman glorified God

2. Jesus Teaches in Synagogue

- a. Pharisees scattered around country teaching in synagogues
- b. Jesus also often taught in synagogues
 - He wandered from place to place in Galilee preaching the kingdom of God
 - several healings took place in the synagogue
- c. Sabbath Day in synagogue was weekly community event

3. People Come to Hear Jesus

- a. Bent woman was in the crowd with everyone else in synagogue
- b. In worship service you don't know every person's circumstances
- c. Bent woman was severely stooped-spine/shoulders
 - she would stand out among others

- 4- Jesus Sees Woman With Need
- a. Jesus could see entire crowd from front of synagogue
 - b. When she first came in, she would shuffle to her seat
 - c. Jesus called her up front
 - d. Entire crowd watched her her shuffling up front
 - e. ~~as~~ She arrives up front with Jesus

- 5- Jesus Heals Woman
- a. He tells her, "You are free from your infirmity."
 - b. Jesus touched her with his hands
 - c. She immediately became straight
 - d. Everyone saw this miracle

6. Jesus Causes Division
- a. Ruler of the synagogue (leader of the assembly) - likely with pharisees
 - ruler was mad
 - he addresses the crowd
 - "No work on Sabbath. Do healing on other 6 days."
 - implication = this is my synagogue (how dare you!)

- b. Jesus called him out
 - Hypocrite
 - every person works taking care of animals on Sabbath Day

- c. Implication: human person of greater value than animals

- d. Question for teaching, "Ought not this woman be loosed on Sabbath?"
- e. His adversaries put to shame before entire crowd
