## 1. Introduction

a. King Josiah 8 years old when he became king

- grandson to bad king Manasseh

- Josiah good king & ruled 31 years

b. Josiah's continued spiritual growth

- age 16: began to seek the God of his father David (34:3)

- age 20: he destroyed false gods & their places of worship

- \* he went through the lands of

- tribes Manasseh, Ephraim,

- Simeon, & Naphtali to destroy

- false gods

- age 26: he set up money & repair workers to repair God's temple

## 2. Rejection

a. What does Josiah reject?

- he rejected his grandfather's false gods (51 years)

b. Noticeable departure (34:1)

- Josiah did what was right in God's sight

c. New direction (34:8)

- Josiah finished removing all the false gods in all Israel

- age 26 (18<sup>th</sup> year of ruling) begins repairing God's temple

### 3. Replacement

- a. Realized cost (34:8-9)
  - remnants of survivors from northern Israel bring money
  - Judea & Benjamin also bring money to temple
- b. Repairs & restoration construction <sup>begins</sup>~~begun~~
- c. Renewed cause (34:12)
  - construction workers did the work faithfully

### 4. Realization (34:14)

- a. Remarkable recovery (34:14)
  - Hilkiah the priest found the Book of the Law (Torah)
- b. Repenting response (34:18~~17~~-21)
  - King Josiah followed custom of behavior in repentance
  - he understood that God's wrath was on the nation for their disobedience
- c. Rigorous resolve (34:29-32)
  - King gathered all the leaders & the people to hear the words of the Book of the Law
  - King led the nation to obey the Books of the Law (34:33)

### 5. Revival

- a. Contagious courage (34:9-33)
  - 1st the king follows God
  - then the leaders
  - finally the people
  - & surrounding lands also affected
- b. Continued commitment
  - "During Josiah's lifetime the people followed the Lord God of their ancestors"
  - all Judah & Israel present (2 Chron 35:18)
- c. All Judah & Israel kept the Passover Feast (2 Chron 35:1-19)
