1. THE Mandate OF MISSIONS (v. 18-20)

A. <u>Premised</u> upon Christ's Authority - based on Jesus' authority Quote: "The only alternative to the Great commission is disobedience."

AN ASSURED AUTHORITY - all power given to Jesus

"Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience:" (Ephesians 2:2)

AN ACTIVE MANDATE - Ge ... & make disciples

B. <u>Performed</u> in Christ's Power

COMES BY HIS SPIRIT

"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

COMES FROM HIS WORD

"For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." (Hebrews 4:12)

"That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; 16 <u>Holding forth the word of life;</u> that I may rejoice in the day of Christ, that I have not run in vain, neither laboured in vain." (Philippians 2:15-16)

"And I, brethren, when I came to you, came not with excellency of speech or of wisdom, declaring unto you the testimony of God. 2 For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified. 3 And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling. 4 And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: 5 That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." (1 Corinthians 2:1-5)

2. THE Methodology OF MISSIONS (Acts 13)

"Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them. 3 And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away." (Acts 13:1-3)

A. Through An institution - the local church

"But if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth." (1 Timothy 3:15)

THEY WERE A MINISTERING CHURCH - Fasting to the THEY WERE A PRAYING CHURCH - Fasting to praying "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. 7 And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7)

THEY WERE A SENDING CHURCH - church sent Barnahas "But I have all, and abound: I am full, having received of Epaphroditus the things which were sent from you, an odour of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, wellpleasing to God. 19 But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:18-19)

B. With a ccoutability - reported back to "And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of

"And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of God for the work which they fulfilled. 27 And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles." (Acts 14:26–27)

ACCOUNTABILITY IN MISSIONS

- The Home Church Remains Strong "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: 25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." (Hebrews 10:24–25)
- 2. The Missionaries Give Reports

"Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; 38 Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:37-38) 3. The Churches <u>Resupply</u> Support - **CONTINUE Pray** "Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no <u>church communicated with me as</u> <u>concerning giving and receiving</u>, but ye only. 16 For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity." (Philippians 4:15-16)

3. THE Message OF MISSIONS (1 Corinthians 15)

A. The gospel of Christ

"For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that <u>Christ died for</u> our sins according to the scriptures; 4 And that he was <u>buried</u>, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4)

"Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; 2 By which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:1–2)

"And he said unto them, <u>Go ye into all the world</u>, and preach the gospel to every creature." (Mark 16:15)

B. The growth of the Believer - cbstrve God's Word "Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Matthew 28:20)

"And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; 12 For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: 13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:" (Ephesians 4:11-13)

C. The <u>sending</u> of Missionaries

"For from you sounded out the word of the Lord not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but also in every place your faith to God-ward is spread abroad; so that we need not to speak any thing. 9 For they themselves shew of us what manner of entering in we had unto you, and how ye turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God;" (1 Thessalonians 1:8-9)
