Text: Matthew 1:18-25

"Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost. 19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not willing to make her a publick example, was minded to put her away privily. 20 But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost. 21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. 22 Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, 23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us. 24 Then Joseph being raised from sleep did as the angel of the Lord had bidden him, and took unto him his wife: 25 And knew her not till she had brought forth her firstborn son: and he called his name JESUS." (Matthew 1:18-25)

INTRODUCTION

(Proverbs 29:11)

- Joseph engaged to Mary

- Joseph's occupation was a carpenter

- Joseph was an honorable man

* he decided to divorce Mary privately

* he did want to make Mary a public

spectacle

* he did not want to shake her

- Mary was already 3 months pregnant

1. THE <u>Devoted</u> OF JOSEPH (v. 18-19a)

"Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: 20 For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God." (James 1:19-20)

B. He Had a Sincere <u>roncero</u> (v. 19)

"And above all things have <u>fervent charity</u> among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins." (1 Peter 4:8)

- Joseph protects Mary & Jesus * completes marriage contract * after birth, they stay in Bethlehem -Joseph thought about future decision -But God intervened in Joseph's life

2. THE Discipline OF JOSEPH (v. 20-25)

A. He Showed patience by Waiting (v. 20, 25)

HE WAS NOT HASTY IN DECISIONS

"My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations;" (James 1:2)

"If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. 6 But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. 7 For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord." (James 1:5-7)

HE WAS PATIENTLY DISCIPLINED

"Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. 25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. 26 I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: 27 But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway." (1 Corinthians 9:24-27)

B. He Showed tenacity by Working (v. 24)

"Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James, and Joses, and Simon, and Judas?" (Matthew 13:55) I es is guestioned

"But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel." (1 Timothy 5:8)

3. THE Dedication OF JOSEPH (v. 20-25)

A. He consented to God's Will (v. 20b-23) he obeyed

THE LORD'S REVELATION

"But the angel said unto him, **Fear not**, Zacharias: for thy prayer is heard; and thy wife Elisabeth shall bear thee a son, and thou shalt call his name John." (Luke 1:13)

"And the angel said unto her, **Fear not**, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God." (Luke 1:30)

"And the angel said unto them, **Fear not**: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people." (Luke 2:10)

THE LORD'S PROPHECY

"Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, And shall call his name Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:14)
