



## 1. Introduction

a. Gospel written by John Mark

- Acts 12:12, 25; 15:37-38

- 2 Tim 4:11

b. Ancient church writings show that Mark was a close companion with Peter

- narratives record match closely with Peter's personality

c. Jesus heals:

- Jairus' daughter

- Woman with trauma of bleeding

d. Emergencies:

- Jairus daughter is dying

- woman poor due to medical cost with continual bleeding

## 2. Keep (Continue) Troubling the Master It's Never Too Late (vs 35-43)

a. Be not afraid - only believe (vs 36)

- Jesus said of dead child,

"The child is... sleeping."

b. It's not what it appears

- Jesus only took along Peter, James, & John to Jairus home

- weeping & wailing at Jairus home

- Jesus says, "Why make this commotion"

- Jesus put all the mourners out of the house

- 2c. Jesus tells daughter, (vs. 41)  
"Little girl, I say to you, arise!"  
- "I say to ~~you~~ thee, arise"  
- "Talitha, cumi." Aramaic
3. Keep Troubling the Master Because  
Nothing is Too Hard (Difficult)  
a. The woman touched Jesus clothing  
b. Jesus, "Who touched My clothes?"  
c. The woman fell down before Him  
d. Jesus calls her daughter of faith
4. Keep Troubling the Master  
Because We Do Not Have Anyone  
Else To Go To (vs 26-34)  
a. woman had spent all her money  
on doctors  
- she continued getting worse  
b. Then she heard about Jesus  
c. Her desperate hope, "I shall be  
made whole if I only ~~be~~ may  
touch His clothes."  
- there was no one else  
d. Jesus felt power going out of  
Himself  
e. He told her in the end, "Go in  
peace."
