Genesis 31:1-2 And he heard the words of Laban's sons, saying, Jacob hath taken away all that was our father's; and of that which was our father's hath he gotten all this glory < wealth >?. ²And Jacob beheld the countenance of Laban, and, behold, it was not toward him as before < Laban did not regard Joseph with favor as before>. → II. Joseph's birth

A. Born of the favorite wife

Genesis 29:30 And he went in also unto Rachel, and he < Jacob > loved also Rachel more than **Leah**, and served with him yet seven other years.

B. Joseph born after a period of barrenness

Genesis 29:31 And when the LORD saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb: but Rachel was barren. God's favor

Genesis 30:22 And God remembered Rachel, and God hearkened to her, and opened her womb. God's mercy

Rachel & Leah's envy & Jealous jealousy Gen 29:30; 29:31; Ger 33-6-7

¹ Rachel died on the journey between Padanaram (today: Turkey) and Canaan (today: Israel) giving birth to Benjamin < his name means "son of the right hand">. Rachel named him Benoni < meaning "son of my sorrow">



- C. Joseph protected during traveling:
 - 1. Esau had vowed to kill Jacob Genesis 27:41
 - 2. Jacob fled to Padanaram where Laban lived Genesis 27:42-44
 - 3. As Jacob is returning, Esau comes out to meet him with 400 horsemen, Genesis 32:6
 - 4. Jacob lines up his wives and sons in reverse order of importance to him

Genesis 33:6-7 Then **the handmaidens** came near, they and their children, and they bowed themselves. ⁷And **Leah** also with her children came near, and bowed themselves: and after came **Joseph near and Rachel**, and they bowed themselves.

D. Joseph loses his mother (and gains a brother) while travelling Genesis 35:16-18 And they *<Joseph's caravan>* journeyed from Bethel; and there was but a little way to come to Ephrath *<Bethlehem, see verse 19>*: and Rachel travailed, and she had hard labor. ¹⁷And it came to pass, when she was in hard labor, that the midwife said unto her, "Fear not; thou shalt have this son also." ¹⁸And it came to pass, as her soul was in departing, (for she died) that she called his name Benoni: but his father called him Benjamin.

Genesis 37:3 Now Israel loved Joseph more than all his children, because he was the son of his old age: and he made him a coat of many colors.

 - A. The bad report while shepherding


